## Trustee Report

The FDA Board of Trustees (BOT) met on May 17, 2024, in Tallahassee, Florida.

The ADA gave the Board a presentation about a pilot program they are implementing concerning membership. The need for change is evident due to a changing landscape with newer generations of dentists and retiring members. There is a massive generational shift with a higher number of Millennials and Gen Z dentists and a decreasing number of Baby Boomer dentists as they retire. Consequently, there has been a steady decline in membership and there will be a market share of less than 50% soon. With the use of Salesforce and Artificial Intelligence, the ADA is hoping to create a more personalized membership experience. Salesforce will help automate the process and AI will enhance processes to

be more efficient and personalized by using predictive models. The ADA hopes the pilot program will improve engagement by customizing the experience to join and renew membership and create personalized benefits. There will be a reduced base rate with base benefits and then options can be added such as JADA and access to data. The hope is that more members will join if costs are less, and services can be added ala carte.

The Florida Dental Association (FDA) staff made a presentation about current membership issues in the FDA. In recent years, dues revenue has increased due to increased cost of dues and not from an increased number of dentists. The growth rate of the number of dentists that are members has been relatively flat in recent years. Florida has benefitted from an increased number of dentists in the state, so the market has increased but the market share (number of members versus total number of dentists) has declined. Currently, the FDA market share is about 52%. This number has declined over the past few years. However, there may be a different way to look at market share and, instead, look at "engagement" share. If the total number of members plus non-members that buy insurance from FDA Services, Inc., (FDAS) and/or attend the Florida Dental Convention (FDC) are added, then the "engagement" share is closer to 80%.

The market share in Florida is decreasing because of the great influx of dentists moving to the state. Florida is experiencing an overall increase in membership.

Regarding FDAS, business has grown tremendously, resulting in higher revenue and net income. This is great news for the FDA and for the FDA Foundation. The percentage of the FDA budget coming from FDAS is increasing whereas the amount from dues is decreasing. This gives the FDA greater flexibility in operating the organization. One type of insurance that FDAS has recently added is cyber-attack insurance. It is important to have this type of insurance and costs about \$200 per month depending on the number of charts and total practice business.

A new program called Jumpstart is being started to help dentists identify pre-dental students as potential staff. Prospective pre-dental students can work at dental offices as assistants to learn about the profession and at the same time can help dentists deal with labor shortage issues. The premise for this program leverages the intelligence of pre-dental students and their ability to learn tasks more quickly than a typical "on the job" trained employee.

A report was given by the FDA Governmental Affairs Office. All bills that were sponsored by the FDA were passed and signed by the governor. Important issues regarding dental insurance and DIY dentistry issues were passed. In the upcoming session, dental therapy will be reintroduced, so it will be important to follow this issue.

A new task force, the New Dentist Task Force, has been started, and is headed by Dr. ArNelle Wright. There will be a new dentist meet and greet at FDC. Also, there will be a pilot mentorship program for new dentists to discuss issues such as the DSO model of practice, clinical assistance and treatment planning and staff management.

FDA Components gave presentations about their views on membership. The big challenge is the declining participation due to younger dentists not joining. From these presentations, the FDA staff will collate ideas and begin an implementation project to help recruit and retain members.

## FLORIDA BOARD OF DENTISTRY REPORT From the Florida Dental Association FDA Chief Legal Officer Casey Stoutamire

The Florida Board of Dentistry (BOD) met in Jacksonville on Friday, May 17, 2025.

The Florida Dental Association (FDA) was represented by BOD Liaison, Dr. **Steve Hochfelder**, and Chief Legal Officer, Casey Stoutamire. Drs. **Andy Brown** and **Jim Haddix** were also in attendance.

BOD members present included: Dr. Jose Mellado, chair; Dr. Nick White, vice-chair; Drs. Brad Cherry, Tom McCawley, and Claudio Miro; hygiene members, Ms. Karyn Hill and Ms. Angela Johnson; and consumer members, Mr. Fabio Andrade and Mr. Ben Mirza. Dr. Christine Bojaxhi was excused. There is one open dental position on the Board that the Governor has not yet filled.

The agenda for this meeting was particularly light. This was most likely due to the staff turnover at the Board. Currently, the Board is searching for an Executive Director (the Board of Nursing Executive Director filled in at this meeting). The former Executive Director, Ms. Allison Dudley, is now serving as the Board Attorney.

The main item of business that the FDA was interested in was the Council on Dental Hygiene report. The Board approved the proposed revision to 64B5-13.001, Determination of Probable Cause. The new rule language is below. This language is not yet effective as it must still go through the administrative rule process.

#### 64B5-13.001 Determination of Probable Cause

(1) The probable cause panel, by majority vote, shall determine whether probable cause exists to believe that a licensee has violated the provisions of Chapter 456 or 466, F.S., or the rules of the Department or Board.

(2) The probable cause panel shall be appointed by the Chairman and shall be composed of three members, two of which must be dentists who hold valid and active dental licenses in this State. At least two members of the probable cause panel must be present to constitute a quorum. If only two members are present, the determination of probable cause shall require the affirmative vote of both members present.

(a) <u>Up to</u> One or two members may be former dentist, <u>dental hygienist</u>, or consumer Board members.

(b) At least one member must be a current Board member who holds a valid and active license in this State.

(c) At least one member must be a current or former consumer member of the Board if one is available and

willing to serve. <u>If a consumer member is not available</u> or willing to serve, a current or former dental hygienist member of the Board shall serve on the panel if available or willing to serve.

(d) When an investigation report of a dental hygienist or a dental radiographer will be considered by the panel, for those investigation reports only, at least one member must be a current or former dental hygienist member of the Board if one is available and willing to serve.

(e) Any former dentist <u>or dental hygiene</u> member of the Board appointed to the panel must currently hold a valid and active dental or <u>dental hygiene</u> license in this State.

(f) Probable cause panel members shall serve for one year terms but may serve successive terms.

(3) The probable cause panel shall meet as necessary to conduct business as determined by the Chairman of the Board or the Chairman of the panel.

In addition, the Board approved language to the rule on the training of hygienists and assistants in administering nitrous oxide. The current rule requires the dentist to train the hygienists and assistants to have a moderate sedation permit. This has caused a hardship for the programs around the state as it is hard to find a dentist with this permit to teach the course. Thus, the Board approved language to amend the rule to state that for training hygienists and assistants in the administration of nitrous oxide, the dentist must hold an unencumbered Florida license or valid teaching permit and be trained in the administration of nitrous oxide. A moderate sedation permit will no longer be required. Again, this rule is not yet effective as it must proceed through the administrative rulemaking process.

The Board also received updates on the various bills affecting the practice of dentistry passed during the 2024 Legislative Session. No rulemaking has begun on any of the legislation.

There were four disciplinary cases, one informal hearing, and one request for an extension of time for fines and costs that included, among other things, non-use of a rubber dam, incorrect implant placement, and incorrect crown placement.

It is much better to be a spectator than a participant in BOD disciplinary cases. The next BOD meeting is scheduled for Friday, August 16, 2024 in Boca Raton.




